Resources

The following exercise is suitable for both beginners of German and more advanced German speakers. For beginners, the recommended resource is the After the Wall PowerPoint presentation entitled 'What was the first Enquete-Kommission'. General Questions

- 1. Why was the first Enquete-Kommission set up?
- 2. Who participated in the first Enquete-Kommission?
- 3. What were the aims of the first Enquete-Kommission?
- 4. What were the outcomes of the first Enquete-Kommission?
- 5. Which of the five aims do you think is the most important? Why?
- 6. The five aims of the first Enquete-Kommission suggest that its main focus was the oppressive nature of the SED. Do you think that this is a useful way of understanding the GDR past? Why (not)?
- 7. If you had been a part of the working group, would you have added any other aims?
- 8. What do the outcomes of the report tell you about the way that the GDR is perceived in unified Germany?
- 9. What do you think the working group is most worried about? What impact could this have on the eastern population in unified Germany?
- 10. In your opinion, which outcome is the most controversial? Why?

Group Discussion Activities

1. Put yourself in their shoes...

Imagine you are:

- a) An easterner who was a committed member of the SED how would you react to the report?
- b) An easterner who was spied on by the Stasi would you be happy with the report?
- c) An easterner who had no direct contact with the SED or Stasi would you feel that this report is a useful way of working through the history of the GDR?
- d) A westerner what impression would this report give you of the GDR? Do you think this is an appropriate depiction?

2. Your group has been given the task of forming a working group to respond to the outcomes of the first Enquete-Kommission. How would you design your investigation?

Think about:

- a) who would participate in your working group;
- b) what your aims would be (remember you are working from the outcomes of the first report);
- c) what your intended outcomes would be.

3. In response to the report, the German sociologist and historian Manfred Wilke wrote:

'Das Urteil der Enquete-Kommission über die Diktatur konnte nur dann überzeugend sein, wenn es zwischen den politischen Verantwortlichen der SED Diktatur und der Bevölkerung unterschied.'¹

- Do you agree that this is an important distinction? Why (not)?
- Are there any difficulties in making this distinction? What are they?
- Do you think that the report is successful in making this distinction?

- 5. In your opinion, is it reasonable to compare the two regimes? Do you think it would be useful? Why (not)?
