# Mauerkonzept - General Questions

### Einleitung (p. 3):

- 1. To whom are sites of remembrance relating to the Berlin Wall dedicated?
- 2. How are such sites intended to benefit future generations?
- 3. Which two sites were particularly highlighted in 2005 for Wall remembrance? Why are these sites important? Do you think they are the most appropriate locations for the memorial? Why (not)?
- 4. Which period was this *Gesamtkonzept* designed to cover? Why was the year 2011 so significant?
- 5. To what extent has the design of the memorial sites been politically influenced? Do you agree that politicians should influence such projects? Why (not)?

## Defizite der Erinnerungspolitik (p. 12):

1. What happened to the Berlin Wall in 1990? Why is this now seen as a problem?

- 2. What do you understand by the term 'authentic place of remembrance' (authentischen Erinnerungsort)? Do you think this idea of 'authenticity' is important? Why (not)?
- 3. How has the attitude of the Berlin population towards the history of the Berlin Wall changed over time? Why do you think this is the case?
- 4. Why is Berlin so popular among tourists? What do they hope to experience when visiting Berlin? How will remembrance sites contribute to this experience?
- 5. Do some research on the internet to find out what the 'kontrovers diskutierte Aktion' at the Haus am Checkpoint Charlie was. What problems does the *Gesamtkonzept* highlight regarding this installation? Do you agree with the report?

Ausgangspunkte der Konzeptarbeitung (pp. 13-15):

- 1. Read paragraphs 3-6 of p. 13. What were the main aims of the concept? (try to name six)
- 2. What were the main concerns of Alliance '90/The Greens (Bündnis 90/Die Grünen) in discussions about the memorials?
- 3. How do they compare to the issues set out by the CDU? What do these differences tell you about the political agendas of the two parties?
- 4. In May 2005, the Berlin Parliament passed a motion in favour of a 'Gesamtkonzept'. What did they want to be included in this document? Which aspect do you think is most important? Why?
- 5. Which sites of remembrance are mentioned at the top of p. 15 that are not included in this *Gesamtkonzept*? In what ways do you think these might complement Wall remembrance sites?

- 1. The Story behind the Pictures.

- 2. According to the website, the Berlin Wall Memorial Site is made up of five elements:
  - the monument
  - the documentation centre
  - the chapel of reconciliation
  - the ghost stations
  - the visitor centre.

Use the information on the website to find out about each of the sites. Which one would you most like to visit if you were:

- a) a tourist?
- b) someone who grew up in West Germany?
- c) a student studying the GDR?
- d) a victim of the Berlin Wall?

Give reasons for your answers.
